Stepwise guide to Declaration of Competence

1) - Visit <u>www.cppe.ac.uk</u> and log in

2) - Make sure you have enabled the CPPE viewer and PharmOutcomes features. This enables the commissioners to check your declaration. You can do this by going to the CPPE homepage. Make sure you are logged in, and then click '**MyCPPE'**



Then click 'Profile'



Scroll down and then click the boxes to enable your **CPPE viewer** and **PharmOutcomes.** If you forget to do this, you will be prompted the first time you click on a declaration of competence topic (see screenshot in appendix one).



CPPE is working with other IT solution companies to link their software to the CPPE website as well as PharmOutcomes.

3)- Click on the light blue box (Contributing evidence to the Declaration of competence system OR Providing NHS and public health services)

5) - Select **NHS Seasonal influenza vaccination ADVANCED** from right hand side.



Declaration of competence

Public health service delivery is now well established in pharmacy. Delivering services such as emergency contraception or stop smoking support are part of everyday practice. We have a wide range of learning programmes and assessments for each of the services, which will help you assure and maintain your competence.

Pharmacy is building strong relationships with public health commissioners who see the benefits of commissioning services from the highly accessible healthcare professional on the high street. The *Declaration of competence* (DoC) system has been developed to support you in assuring commissioners that you are service-ready and have the appropriate knowledge, skills and behaviours to deliver high-quality, consistent services. Many commissioners are now including the DoC system in their service specifications, service level agreements and patient group directions. You can also download a <u>factsheet</u> and <u>further information for community pharmacy professionals</u>.

As you work through the DoC system you will use the resources to reflect on your current competences, and identify and meet your learning and assessment needs for each service. Look at this example of a completed DoC for emergency contraception.

7) - Click on Step 1: Recommended learning – this shows the recommended learning provided by CPPE which will help you provide evidence that you are competent to provide this service. It will also indicate which learning you have completed and when. You will see from the screenshot below that this learner has completed the e-learning and distance learning on consultation skills but has not attended a workshop. This learning is not compulsory but is recommended— it is listed here to help you reflect on what you have done and what you might wish to revisit once you have completed the competency framework in step 3. This stage helps you identify gaps in your learning which you need to address.

Step 1: Recommended learning You will find below a list of the learning linked to the competences for this service. It also shows a record of when you have completed this learning, providing guidance on learning you may wish to revisit or access for the first time. 8) - Click on Step 2: Supporting assessments – this will show the CPPE assessments that are available to support the service. Passing these assessments will provide you with evidence that you meet the competences to provide the service. As DoC places the responsibility for competence to provide a service on the pharmacy professional, it is not compulsory to pass all these assessments but you will need to be able to provide other evidence that shows you can meet the competencies (for example, any locally run workshops on safeguarding). Also, if you think you are competent then the assessment is good evidence to support this. In other words, if you are competent then why wouldn't you do the assessment to show this?

This self-assessment tool provides a framework to self-assess competence to deliver the NHS seasonal influenza vaccination ADVANCED service.

In addition to the specific competences linked to the service, it is expected that pharmacy professionals will meet the core competencies within each framework.

Look at this example of a completed DoC for emergency contraception.

10) - Read the DoC. Part A will provide you with ideas for how you can use CPPE learning programmes as evidence of your learning and competence to meet both the core and service specific competencies. Of course you may also have attended local training events or undertaken other learning. Part B is the actual Declaration of Competence framework and is the part of the document that you must work through.

11)– Completing part B - In order to declare yourself competent to provide any NHS service you must provide evidence that you meet the <u>core competencies</u> of consultation skills and safeguarding. You must show that you are aware of and are working towards Health Education England's *Consultation skills for pharmacy practice: Practice Standards for England*. You must also show that you are aware of your responsibilities on safeguarding. The screenshot below shows examples of how you can provide evidence that you meet the <u>core competencies</u>. You will need to complete the blue boxes yourself.

12) - You will also need to provide evidence that you meet the service <u>specific</u> <u>competencies</u> for the service. For example, the first competence requires that you are able to communicate to a patient the benefits of vaccination versus the risks of disease.



If you are struggling with how to complete this section, then check back in Part A, section 4.2. This will give you ideas for how you can use CPPE learning programmes to meet the competencies. For this competence it suggests the CPPE open learning programmes, *Immunisation in pharmacies* and *Influenza module 1: understanding the disease*. It also suggests that you can meet the competence by reading the relevant section of Public Health England's '*Green Book*'. Please note that this is <u>suggested</u> learning – you may feel that you can meet these competences through other learning.

13) - Save this self-assessment document on your computer and when you have completed it save it in your own personal CPD file. This document belongs to you and will support you with your CPD for the service and help you when you complete the DoC next time.

14) - Go back to the CPPE website and click on Step 4: Print your statement of declaration. You will need to fill in the box titled 'Learning and assessment completed from other providers' by adding in details of any practical vaccination training, basic life support or assessment that you have undertaken. Then tick all the boxes under the heading 'Declaration by pharmacy professional'. You can do both these on line as it is an interactive PDF document. Again you will need to save this to your PC or laptop then you need to print off and sign this declaration statement. Make sure you keep your statement in the pharmacy as your employer/GPhC may wish to see this.



15) - Click on Step 5: Update your CPPE learning record and tick the box to confirm that you have signed the Declaration of competence (the document you printed off and signed) and add your date of declaration. Then press save. This is a vital step as it links to your 'my cppe' records and validates your declaration. When you enter you 'my cppe' records you will be able to see clearly when you are due to update your declaration.
